Tax Title Properties: Three properties taken by the town for tax arrears were listed for sale by public tender (one commercial and two residential). No bids were received. The three properties will now be reviewed and listed with Realtors for sale if/when in appropriate condition to do so.

Noise Bylaw: A revised and updated noise bylaw has been reviewed by legal counsel and presented to Town Council for review. It will be on the agenda for the next meeting.

Water & Sewer Repair Policy: Revisions are being prepared for this policy that will reflect the Town covering part or all of the cost of sewer line repairs/replacement that are on Town property similar to how we manage water lines. All repairs will be subject to the property owner signing an Agreement for Repair. The policy will be revised and brought to Council for approval at the next meeting.

Municipal Insurance: Council has authorized the renewal of our municipal insurance policy through SUMAssure our insurance provider for the 2020 year.

Building Assessments: We are performing structural and condition assessments on five municipal buildings: hall, museum, old fire hall, Thompson meats building and the SportsPlex. The field work has been completed by Concentric. The report will aid the Town in better planning and preparing for the future of those buildings and assist us in meeting our asset management requirements which are now a requirement of the Federal Gas Tax Grant program.

Recreational Policies: Management staff along with the Parks, recreation and Culture Committee of Council are completing review of our recreational policies (Golf Course, Hall, SportsPlex) with the goal to have recommended revisions prepared for full Council review at the next meeting.

By-election Update: The call for nominations has been posted and a mail-drop was sent out. The deadline to submit a nomination is 4:00 pm on September 18th. We do have forms and a few other resources posted on our website as well as available at the office to provide people with more information on running for office.

Summer is Over

No one likes to admit it but summer is over. Here are a few tips to prepare your property this fall for the cold season ahead:

1. Trim weak branches or trees that could fall on your home under the weight of a heavy snowfall. From September 1 - March 31 it is safe to prune elm trees.
2. If you are away from your residence for more than a couple of days, ensure that you have someone checking your property daily.
3. Driplines may only be turned on or off by our Public Works Department otherwise the property owner is responsible for the full cost of water usage. Even with a dripline installed and operating, water and sewer lines can still freeze. *It is up to the property owner to ensure they have appropriate insurance coverage.*
