While many regional and other campgrounds are re-opening under stage 2-3 of the re-open Saskatchewan plan, they must still follow strict restrictions regarding taking bookings, limited capacity, bathrooms, etc. Due to these factors Council has determined that the Naicam Campground will remain closed until further notice.

A possible date for reopening of all other facilities, including playgrounds has not yet been set by the Province. Those facilities, including the spray park, remain closed under provincial order.

Council will continue to review these matters with COVID-19 updates at each Council meeting. We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause and appreciate your cooperation.

CURBSIDE BINS ROLLING OUT THIS JUNE

The Town will be officially making the move to residential curbside garbage pickup around mid-June. **Watch your mail and our website for more information and announcements.**

Pickup will be every two weeks on the same day as usual. Please be aware of the following important changes due to the curbside program and our new Waste Management Bylaw.

** NEW! **

- **ALL garbage pickup will be Front Street all year round.** Do not place bins in the alley.
- Bins must be **placed by 7 am** on pickup day and removed within 18 hours. Point the arrows on the cart lid toward the street.
- Allow 4 feet of clearance on both sides of the cart from objects such as other carts, vehicles, etc. and 14 feet overhead clearance for the arm to pickup the bin.



- All garbage must be bagged.
- Items beside or on top of the carts will not be picked up.
- Cart lids must be closed.
- Garbage bag **tags are no longer needed** for residential pick-up. They can still be used to deposit garbage at the transfer station. There is no buy back program for tags.
- **One bin** will be provided per residential household. **Users may not opt out** of the curbside bin program.
- **Only these bins are permitted in residential areas.** Use of larger bin, including those privately rented are not allowed except with a permit. Residential users who currently have these bins will be required to have them removed unless a permit is obtained. Reasons a permit may be issued include removal of construction, demolition or renovation debris, and seasonal yard cleanup.
- The replacement of lost or damaged cart(s) shall be at the cost of the property owner, regardless if by theft, damage, or vandalism. Please protect your cart and make note of your cart's serial number.

PROPERTY ASSESSMENT FAQ

SAMA (Saskatchewan Assessment Management Agency) has provided our annual assessments and the assessment roll is open until July 17, 2020. Any property owner can appeal their assessment while the roll is open by completing the required form and submitting the fee. There is a fee to appeal of \$50 per residential property and \$150 for commercial/industrial. For more information on assessments contact us.
